

THINGS TO REMEMBER

- Park hours are 8 a.m. to dusk. Quiet hours are 10 p.m. to 6:30 a.m.
- Winter schedule: Main campground is closed Oct. 15 to April 30. The Vacation Lodge is open year round. Although most parks are open year round, some parks or portions of parks are closed during the winter. For a winter schedule and information about seasonal closures, call the information center at 360-902-8844 or visit parks.wa.gov.
- Wildlife, plants and all park buildings, signs, tables and other structures are protected; removal or damage of any kind is prohibited. Hunting, feeding of wildlife and gathering firewood on state park property is prohibited.
- **Campground is a group camp only** and available by reservation. Reservations may be made up to nine months ahead. To make a reservation call 509-664-6373
- Camping check-in time is 2:30 p.m., and check-out time is 1 p.m.
- Extra vehicle overnight - \$10 per night in designated area for each vehicle in excess of the one allowed per site. Does not apply to vehicle towed by a recreational vehicle.
- Pets must be on leash and under physical control at all times. This includes trail areas and campsites. Pet owners, including horse riders, must clean up after pets on all state park lands.
- Pets are not allowed in the Vacation Lodge or within the Vacation Lodge complex.
- Engine-driven electric generators may be operated only between the hours of 8 a.m. and 9 p.m.

WELCOME TO SQUILCHUCK STATE PARK

Squilchuck State Park is a beautiful forested park of fir and ponderosa pine, just below Mission Ridge at an elevation of 3,200 feet in the Wenatchee area of Central Washington. This 249-acre park features steeply forested hillsides with meadows and rock outcrops. Visitors can see expansive views to the north of the Columbia River watershed. The park is open year around.

Visitors enjoy the park's 5 miles of trails in the warmer seasons, along with wildlife and wildflower viewing. In the fall, the park sports brilliant autumn color. In the winter season, the park is a popular destination for snowshoeing, traditional style Nordic skiing, fat tire mountain biking and snow play.

Local services are available within a few miles of the park, and local wineries and wine-tasting events are also offered nearby.

OVERNIGHT ACCOMMODATIONS



One group camp that accommodates up to 100 guests (20 guest minimum) and is available by reservation only.



Campsites accommodate tents and cars or smaller RVs, but there are no RV hookups at the group camp.

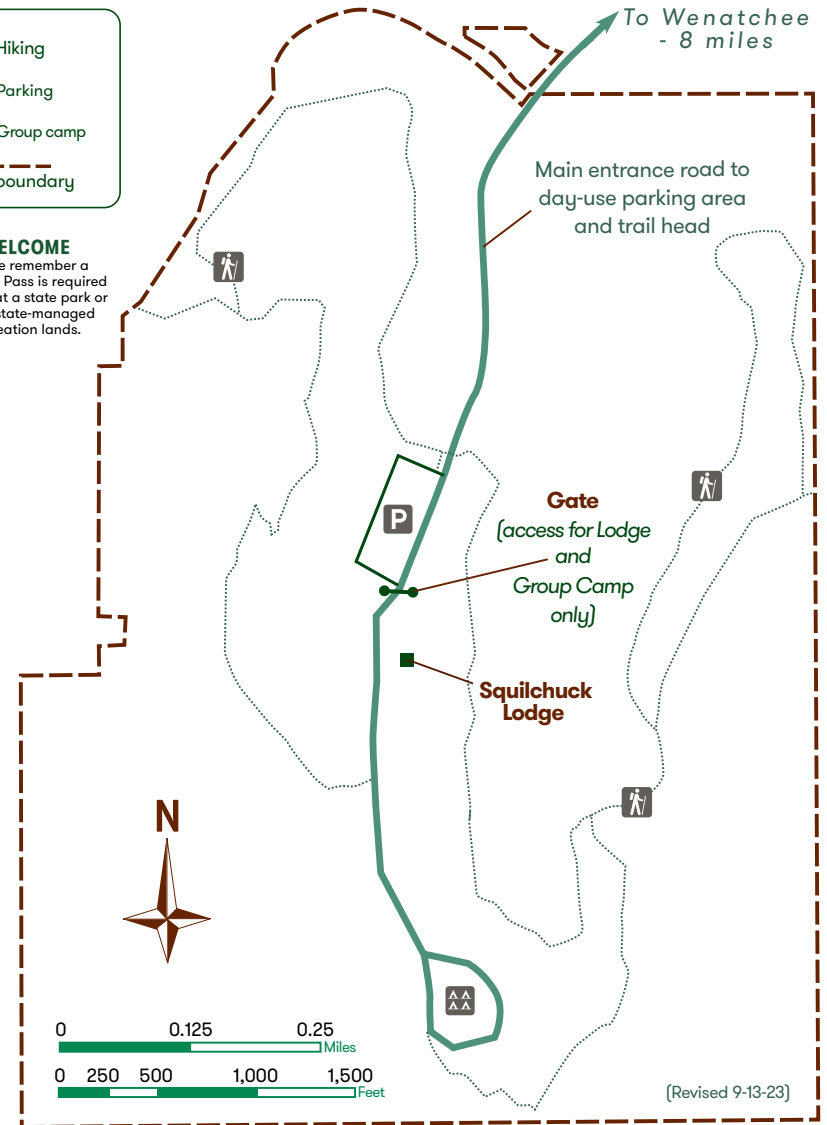

SQUILCHUCK LODGE

The Squilchuck Lodge is available by reservation for day-use events and gatherings such as weddings and reunions. The lodge accommodates up to 75 guests. A large grassy area adjacent to the building makes it work well

for group gatherings. Amenities include a range and oven, two refrigerators and a microwave. Tables and chairs are available for indoor seating, and there are picnic tables for outdoor seating. To reserve the lodge, call Wenatchee Confluence State Park at (509) 664-6373.
