Topics may include earth sciences, geology, ecology, or history of Mount St. Helens. Additional information for your visit:

We would like teachers to remind their students to follow proper museum etiquette. A staff-member will greet your group upon arrival to discuss these expectations.

Mount St. Helens Visitor Center is history-based. We have a functioning seismograph, interactive displays and exhibits, chronological eruption timeline, walk-through volcano model and a 13-minute film covering the eruption of Mount St. Helens. We also have a 0.6-mile boardwalk trail overlooking the Silver Lake wetland ecosystem. Our location offers a west side view of the mountain at a 30-mile distance.

No food or drinks are allowed in the building. If you are interested in having lunch during your visit, picnic tables are available in the day-use area at Seaquest State Park. For large groups, you can bus your students across the road to Seaquest State Park. Personal vehicles are required to display a Discover Pass at Seaquest, school buses are exempt. For large groups, please ask staff for a trash bag for garbage, we can collect them later.

The Johnston Ridge Observatory, operated by the U.S. Forest Service, is closed through 2027 due to a landslide that occurred in 2023. They are currently not accepting school visits.
