

Overnight accommodations

Riverside's main campground is in an area of the park known as the Bowl and Pitcher. There are 16 standard (tent) campsites, 13 RV partial-hookup sites with electricity and water, two RV full-hookup sites with electricity, water and sewer, and two cabins to accommodate up to five people. Dogs allowed in one cabin only. Both cabins are heated and include a bathroom, bunkbed, futon, sink, microwave and table.

There are two large group camp areas located at the Bowl and Pitcher areas that accommodate either 20 or 60 tent campers (no trailers) and one group camp at Lake Spokane that accommodates up to 25 campers. Fees are based on the number of campers. The Lake Spokane Campground has 10 standard (tent) campsites and one companion site to accommodate up to 12 people.

Park-wide amenities and facilities

- Approximately 80 miles of hiking, biking and equestrian trails.
- Three waterfront launches and 120 feet of dock.

Bowl and Pitcher

- Four non-motorized boat launches, two on the Spokane River and two on the Little Spokane River. The Little Spokane River is restricted to kayaks, canoes, rafts, and paddleboards. Inner tubes, bicycles and pets are not allowed in this natural area. The Spokane River is hazardous in places and should not be run by inexperienced river rafters. Launch fee is required on vehicles with trailers.
- Picnic shelters and tables are available on a first come, first served basis.
- Interpretive activities.

Equestrian Area

- Two cabins to accommodate up to five people. Dogs allowed in one cabin only.
- Trailer-dump station.
- Kitchen shelter constructed out of logs with electricity and water. Includes a wood stove, sink and eight picnic tables. The shelter accommodates up to 60 guests. Reservations highly recommended by calling (509) 327-2635.

Lake Spokane

- Two picnic shelters (no electricity/water).
- Campground with 10 standard (tent) sites that can accommodate RVs of varying length, and one companion site to accommodate up to 12 campers.
- One group site to accommodate up to 25 campers. Includes shelter, water, electricity, and sewer connection.
- Eight picnic shelters (no electricity or water).
- Boat launch with dock for fishing.
- Swimming area.
- Four boat-in camping areas (1-3 sites in each area).

Nine Mile Recreation Area

- Trailer-dump station.
- Three kitchen shelters with electricity and water. Two of the shelters can accommodate 20 guests, and one accommodates 40 guests.
- Boat launch and swimming area.

Off-Road Vehicle Area

- 600 acres with dedicated beginner riding and training areas.
- Three picnic shelters with barbecues.


Spokane River Centennial State Park Trail

- The 40-mile-long paved trail that runs between the Washington-Idaho state line and the Nine Mile Recreation Area.
- Thirteen miles of the trail runs through Riverside State Park between Spokane Falls Community College and the Nine Mile Recreation Area.

Reservations

Reservations can be made online up to nine months in advance. This park also allows visitors to make same-day camping reservations. Visitors can reserve same-day campsites until 4 p.m. the day they would like to camp. Same-day reservations can be made the same way as regular reservations. WELCOME TO RIVERSIDE STATE PARK

Riverside State Park is a beautiful camping park that lies along the Spokane River near Spokane. Riverside has the second-largest land area of any state park in Washington, with 9,194 acres and nearly 200,000 feet of shoreline along running rivers and freshwater marshes.

The main campground within the park is Bowl and Pitcher, which is nestled along the Spokane River amongst towering Ponderosa Pines. It's known for the iconic swinging bridge that connects the campground and the day-use area to miles of trails on the other side of the river.

The Nine Mile Recreation Area offers swimming, picnicking and other water recreation opportunities. The Lake Spokane Campground and Day-Use Area provides secluded camping spots, a variety of picnic shelters overlooking the lake, a swimming area and a boat launch with a dock for fishing. The Equestrian Area offers horseback riding on hundreds of acres with loop

trails, camping, an arena and obstacle course. The 600-acre off-road vehicle park includes a dedicated beginner riding area.

The Spokane River Centennial State Park Trail, which features nearly 40 miles of trail for walking, hiking and bicycling along the river. The Centennial Trail runs beyond the park boundaries and continues through Spokane. It eventually connects with the North Idaho Centennial Trail in Post Falls, Idaho.

Visitors to Riverside can enjoy the diverse array of recreational opportunities, including picnicking, camping, rock climbing, hiking, fishing, boating, wildlife viewing, kayaking, biking and snowshoeing.

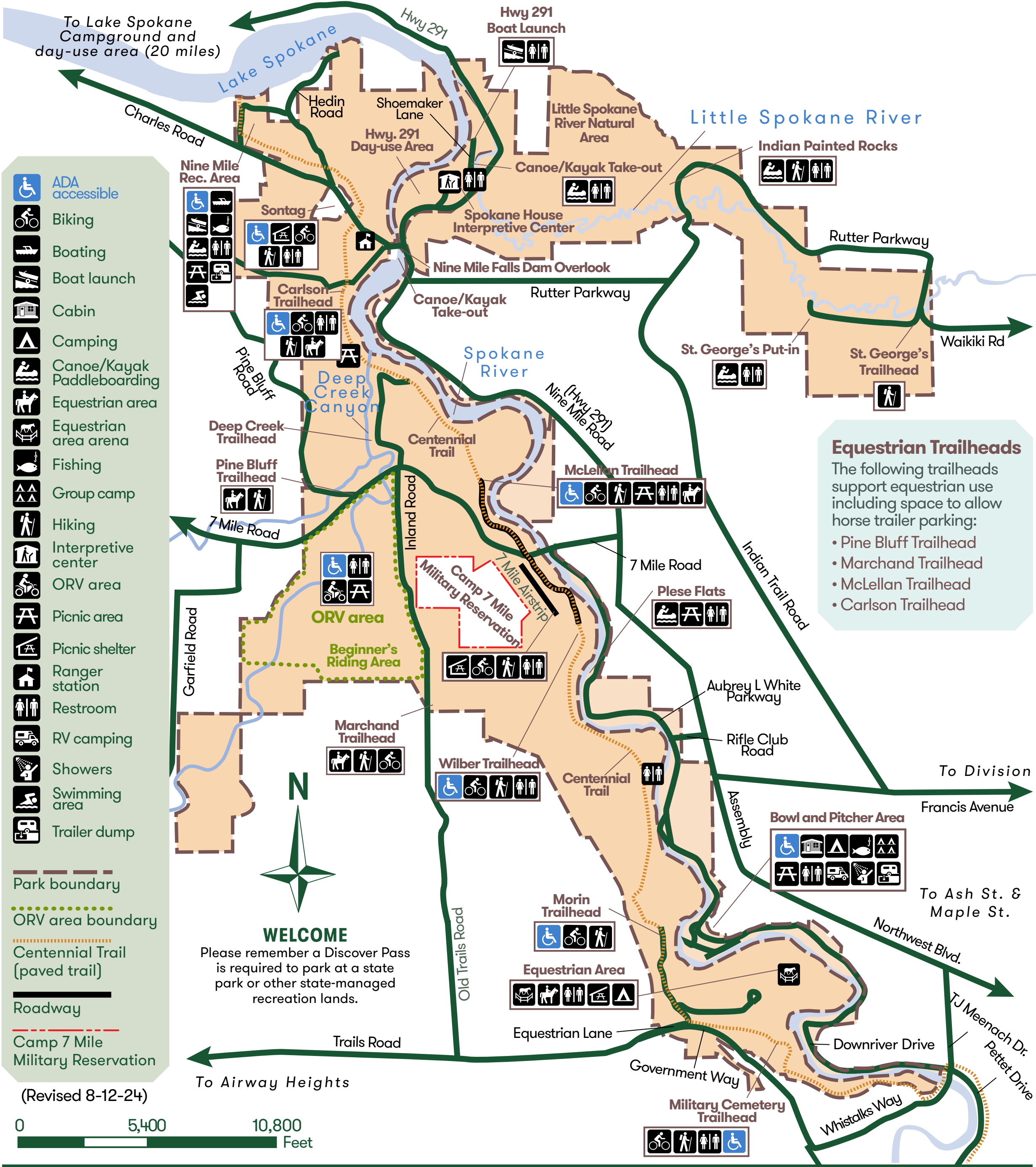
