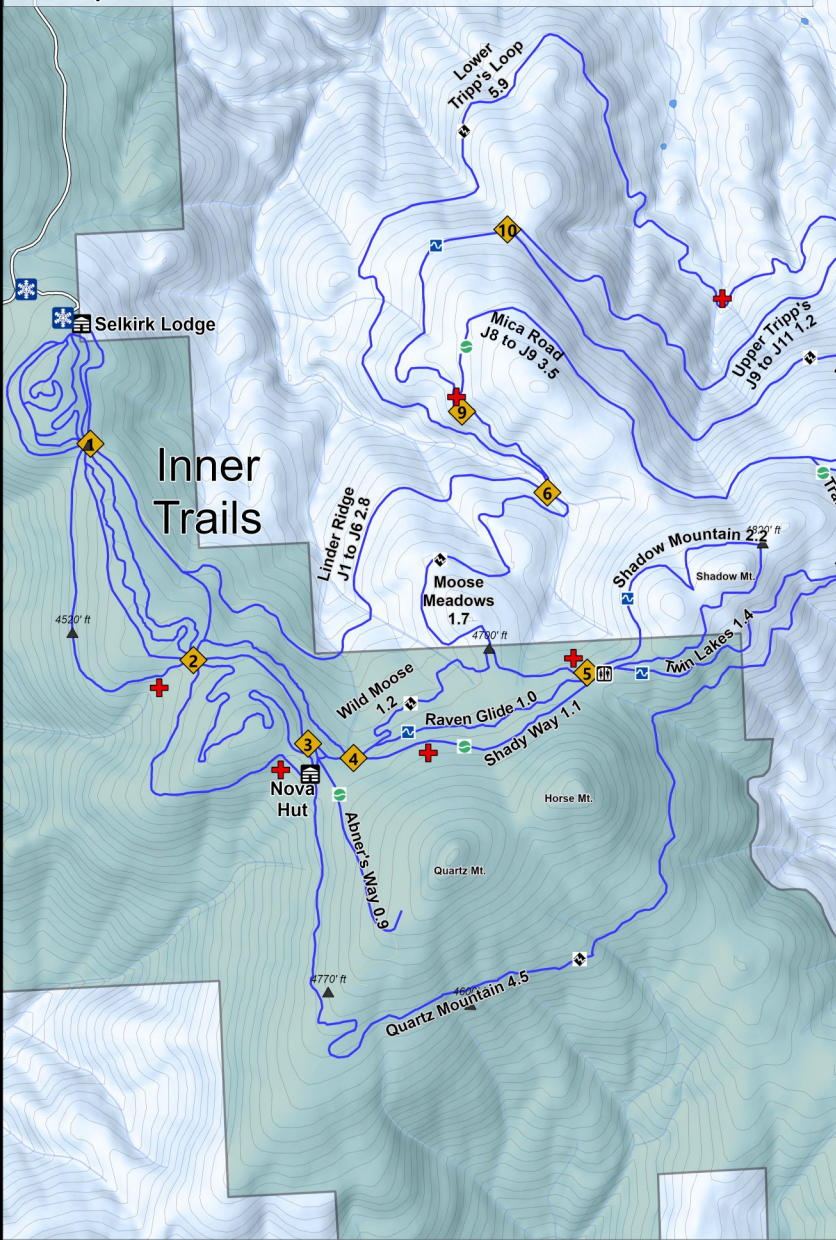


Sno-Park Permit required Dec. 1 – Mar. 31. Available for purchase at park office or www.parks.state.wa.us/130/Winter-Recreation



PLEASE REMEMBER:

- Do not walk on groomed trails.
- Snowshoeing, fat tire biking, and sledding are not allowed in the Nordic area.
- Downhill skiers have the right of way.
- Dogs are only allowed in the Nordic area for Skijoring and in keeping with the skijor rules listed below.

Skijoring Rules:

- Skijoring is allowed Sunday through Thursday after 12 p.m. and all day on Wednesday.
- Skijoring is only allowed on the following groomed Nordic trails: Linder Ridge, Mica Road, Lower Tripp's and Upper Tripp's (uphill only).
- Dogs are not permitted in warming huts.
- Dogs must be on a harness and attached to the human skier at all times. A dog leashed on a collar and running with a skier is not allowed.
- Dog owners are responsible for skiing under control and keeping their dogs under control at all times.
- When meeting and/or passing other skiers the skier and the dog must be together on the same side of the trail.
- Dog owners must pick up and carry out dog waste.
