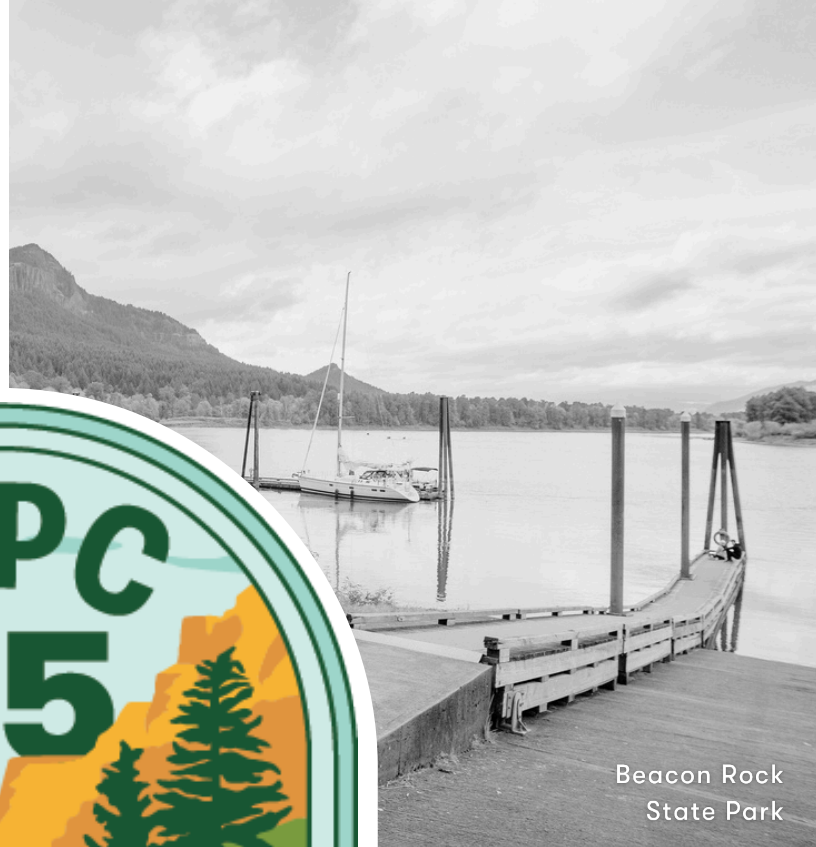

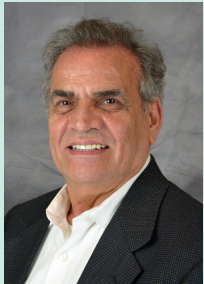

KEYNOTE SPEAKER COMMISSIONER SOPHIA DANENBERG



Sophia Danenberg is a rock, ice and mountain climber who has climbed mountains across the globe — from the Matterhorn and Chamonix in the Alps to Kilimanjaro and Mount Kenya in Africa to Aconcagua in South America. In 2006, she made history by becoming the first black woman and the first black American to summit Mount Everest. She is a Washington State Parks and Recreation Commissioner and volunteers on the board of NatureBridge, an environmental education non-profit operating in national parks. She is also very active in her union, currently serving on the state and national Legislative & Public Affairs committees for the Society of Professional Engineering Employees in Aerospace (SPEEA.)

Professionally, Sophia is an Associate Technical Fellow for international environmental policy at Boeing, primarily focusing on chemicals and waste policy. In this role, she represents the company on multiple trade associations and interfaces with global organizations such as the European Union, Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation and various UN multilateral conventions on behalf of the aerospace and defense industry. Before starting her career, Sophia was a researcher-writer for a travel guide in Thailand and Laos and a Fulbright Fellow at Keio University in Tokyo. She graduated magna cum laude from Harvard University in environmental sciences and public policy and completed graduate coursework in environmental economics and law at the University of Connecticut.

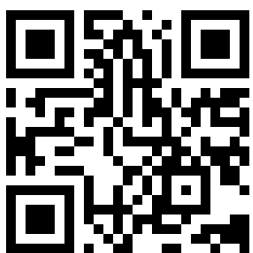

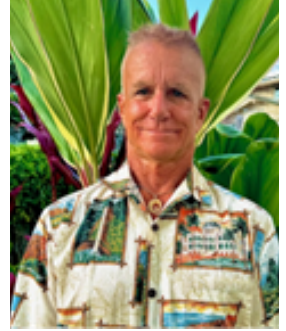

KEYNOTE SPEAKERS HAWAII STATE PARKS

Curt A. Cottrell: Administrator, Division of State Parks, Department of Land and Natural Resources

I moved to Hawai'i from California in 1983 with a degree in Geography and Planning, initially planning a one-month backpacking trip to explore the island's national and state parks. I ended up staying and living in Hana, Maui, where I worked in various roles and was deeply immersed in Hawaiian culture and values. In 1988, I relocated to Honolulu and took a staff position as Committee Clerk for the House Committee on Planning, Energy, and Environmental Protection, which introduced me to Hawai'i's state government and environmental issues. This role eventually led to my work at the Department of Land and Natural Resources (DLNR).



Over the next 36 years, I held various positions within DLNR, including 18 years in the Division of Forestry and Wildlife, where I managed the Na Ala Hele Trail and Access Program, and 16 years in the Division of State Parks, where I am currently the Administrator. My work focused on resource protection, recreation management, and fostering community partnerships. Outside of work, I enjoy cycling, running, hiking and canoe paddling, and am a proud father of two daughters. I feel privileged to lead efforts in preserving the natural and cultural resources that initially drew me to Hawai'i.

Alan Carpenter: Assistant Administrator of the Hawaii State Parks Division

Alan Carpenter plays a key role in the preservation and enhancement of the state's natural and cultural resources. With a background in cultural resource management and public service, he oversees a diverse park system that includes iconic sites such as Diamond Head, Nāpali Coast and 'Iolani Palace. Mr. Carpenter is recognized for his leadership and dedication to preserving the historical integrity of these parks while promoting cultural heritage and education.



With over three decades of experience in parks and recreation, Mr. Carpenter is known for his strategic approach and commitment to community engagement. He was instrumental in the development and implementation of the Hā'ena Master Plan. Holding degrees in Anthropology and Historic Preservation, along with a Master's in Public Administration, he is passionate about ensuring Hawaii's parks are protected for future generations to enjoy.

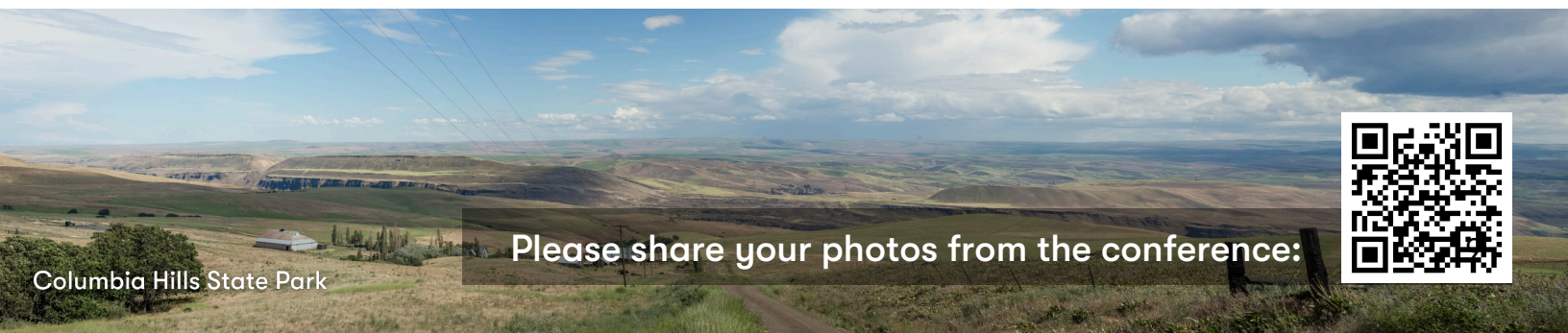
