Cama Beach was owned and operated as a popular resort by the Risk family starting in the 1930s. The family wanted the property to remain intact and open to the public after the decades that they had managed it for the enjoyment of all. To that end, it was specially recognized on the National Register of Historic Places as the only resort of its kind remaining in the U.S., and sold/donated under special conditions to the State of WA to continue to be a resort open to the public.

I seriously doubt if the sisters would have gifted half and sold the other half so inexpensively to the state if they had had any inkling that their legacy would be closed down after little more than a decade. WA state parks owe them much more than an apology and owe the public much more than lame excuses for closing the best park around.

Along with so many heartbroken and disappointed citizens I am eager to hear word from the Parks that work might be underway regarding the future of this precious gem of natural space at Cama Beach. The vote to close the cabins was conspicuously done as far from Camano as you could possibly get and no public comments have been made regarding this tragic decision. The "staff recommendation" to close the cabins is the only recommendation to the commissioners that did not identify the authors of the document.
